School News

Tiny Lives fundraiser:

Thank you to everyone who gave so generously to our recent 'Tiny Lives' fundraiser. Many of our children have directly benefitted from the wonderful work that the organisation does and it is a lovely way for us all to say thank you for all of the great work that they do. Louise, from 'Tiny Lives' came into school and worked with all classes, explaining the life-saving work that goes on before our pupils completed a sponsored event. Thanks to you all, we raised an amazing £1557.15 which will help more premature babies to be cared for.

Choir:

On Tuesday 26th November, our school choir joined other schools from Newcastle in a singing event at St Nicholas' Cathedral. Thank you to Mrs Armstrong who leads our choir and all of the children who sang beautifully and represented our school well.

Year 5 Carol Service:

On Wednesday 4th December, our Year 5 class joined all of the Year 5 pupils from the Newcastle Catholic schools in a joint carol service at St Mary's Cathedral. It was a lovely occasion and our pupils represented our school very well.

Christmas Lunch:

Thank you to all of those parents who were able to join us for Christmas lunch this week. As usual, it was a lovely event and a really lovely way to start our school Christmas celebrations. Photographs will be shared on our school Facebook page.

Safeguarding:

Following on from the work completed in school linked to National Road Safety, we recently spoke to all of the children about the importance of keeping safe outside on dark evenings. We shared general information about staying safe and the importance of an adult always knowing where you were but we also spoke to them about staying safe by being seen. We shared information about wearing bright or reflective items of clothing to help us to be seen on dark night by drivers and distributed small reflective badges, which were given as a gift from a local company.

As we approach the holiday season, can I respectfully remind parents of the importance of monitoring children's online activities to ensure that they are always acting safely and responsibly when online and also that they are kept safe from any of the online dangers that we are aware of.

Attendance Update:

As you will be aware, our school target for attendance is 97%. The Local Authority are really focusing on attendance as Newcastle school have quite poor attendance rates compared to their neighbours.

Mrs Cook will remain as the classroom support, again assisting with a smooth transition for the children.

Miss Young will be joining our school office team for two terms whilst Miss Cummings is on maternity leave.

Miss Whitehead Joel will be joining the staff as a classroom teaching assistant initially for two terms to provide classroom support and intervention support for Year 5.
